  - OSC and Planning Commission resolve conflicts with other Town policies

### 2006 Open Space Resolution

Town advise Proponents it will consider:



1. How project preserves open space and rural character in project, surroundings, and the Town generally.

2. How projects dedicate land for open space instead of simply paying mitigation fees.

## Fund Open Space Sustainably

- Open Space funding is not discretionary
- > Need to fund:

◆ Purchase of properties, conservation and public

easements

 Development of trails (bicycle, equestrian and pedestrian)

- ◆ Wildlife habitat and corridors
- Planning documents
- ◆ Education and outreach
- Long-term maintenance
- Not just development impact fees
- Need to ID projects to pursue for grants

## Educate and Involve Residents and Businesses

- Early notification of public on projects before Planning Commission review
- Education & Training needed of public of how and when to get involved
- Training of developers on Town policies
- Collaborate with rural networks
- Events (3-9-06 Forum, Earth Day)



## Promote Placer Land Trust (PLT) Partnership

- PLT offers Tools for Town to use in preserving Open Space
- Set up PLT Loomis Basin Account
- Solicited donations from businesses
- Extend MOU beyond 6-30-07

#### Rural Roadways

  - Laird Road
  - Brace Road
